

ORDINANCE NO. 18

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE MAINTENANCE OF DITCHES AND RIGHTS OF WAY WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF DALTON GARDENS, IDAHO, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO CAST, THROW, DUMP, OR DEPOSIT ANY GLASS, BOTTLES, CANS, BOARDS, TRASH, DEBRIS, GARBAGE, JUNK, DIRT, SOD, STONES, GRAVEL, GRASS CLIPPINGS, BRUSH, LIMBS, BRANCHES, FOLIAGE, LEAVES, OR ANY OTHER SUBSTANCE WHATEVER IN OR UPON THE DITCHES OF THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE VILLAGE OF DALTON GARDENS OR ANY PART OF THE RIGHTS OF WAY FOR SUCH STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE VILLAGE OF DALTON GARDENS, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Chairman and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dalton Gardens:

SECTION I. It shall be unlawful for any person to cast, throw, dump or deposit any glass, bottles, cans, boards, trash, debris, garbage, junk, dirt, sod, stones, gravel, grass clippings, brush, limbs, branches, foliage, leaves, or any other substance whatsoever in or upon the ditches of the streets and highways of the Village of Dalton Gardens or any part of the rights of way for such streets and highways.

SECTION II. Any violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punishable by fine not to exceed \$300.00, or imprisonment not exceeding six months, or both such fine and imprisonment,

SECTION III. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication in one issue of the Coeur d'Alene Press, being the official newspaper of said Village.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Chairman and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dalton Gardens:

SECTION I.
