ORDINANCE NO. 94

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DALTON GARDENS AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 76 TO PROVIDE FOR ADDITIONAL MEMBERS OF THE PARK AND RECREATION BOARD; ESTABLISHING THE TERMS THEREOF; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALTON GARDENS, IDAHO:

SECTION 1. CREATION OF A PARK AND RECREATION BOARD.

There is hereby created a Park and Recreation Board for the City of Dalton Gardens.

SECTION 2. MEMBERS. The members of the Board shall consist of ~~three~~ five members, ~~one~~ two of whom shall serve until January 1, ~~1981~~ 1985, and ~~two~~ three of whom shall serve until January 1, ~~1982~~ 1986, or until their successors are appointed. Thereafter, all members shall serve for a term of two (2) years, or until their successors are appointed. All members of the Board shall be appointed by the Mayor from the citizens of the City, with the confirmation of the Council, of which one member, but not more than one member, may also be a member of the Board.

SECTION 3. VACANCIES. All vacancies shall be immediately reported to the Mayor by the Board and shall be filled by appointment in the same manner that appointments are originally made. Appointments to complete an unexpired term shall be for the residue of the term only. No compensation shall be allowed or paid to any member in any manner whatever.

SECTION 4. RULES AND REGULATIONS. Said Board members shall immediately after their appointment meet and organize by election of one of their members Chairman and by election of such other officers as they deem necessary. They shall make and adopt such rules, by-laws and regulations for their own guidance and shall make recommendations to the Mayor and City Council for the operation of parks and recreation programs as the City may deem expedient. They shall have control of the expenditures and all monies collected for the parks and recreation and such care, supervision and custody of the parks and recreation programs of the City as may be delegated to them by the Mayor and Council, and such money shall be drawn from the Treasury by the proper officials upon the properly authenticated vouchers of the members of the Park and Recreation Board.

SECTION 5. REPORTS REQUIRED. Said Park and Recreation Board shall make semi-annual reports to the Mayor and City Council at the first meeting in January and the first meeting in July. Such reports shall state the condition of their trust and the various amounts of money received by the Park and Recreation Board and their sources and how much has been expended, the work accomplished by the Board and such other statistics and information and suggestions as they may deem of general interest and the Mayor and City Council may require.

SECTION 6. DONATIONS. All persons desirous of making donations of money, personal property or real estate for the benefit of the parks and recreation programs of the City may

vest the title to the same in the Park and Recreation Board to be held and controlled by said Board, and such Board shall have the right to receive the same and shall be held and considered to be the special trustees therefor.

SECTION 7. PARK FUND. There is hereby created a special fund to be known as the Park Fund, which shall be kept by the Treasurer apart and separate from other monies of the Municipality to be used exclusively for the maintenance and care of the parks of the City, and all monies for the use and benefit of said parks shall be kept in said Park Fund.

SECTION 8. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication in one issue of the Coeur d'Alene Press, a newspaper of general circulation, published in Coeur d'Alene, Kootenai County, Idaho.

Passed under suspension of the rules upon which a roll call vote was taken and duly enacted an Ordinance of the City of Dalton Gardens, Idaho, at a regular meeting of the Mayor and City Council held on March 1, 1984.
