ORDINANCE NO. 116

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DALTON GARDENS, IDAHO, PROVIDING FOR THE QUALIFICATIONS OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF DALTON GARDENS; THE TERM OF OFFICE FOR THE MAYOR; AND VACANCY IN SAID OFFICE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALTON GARDENS, KOOTENAI COUNTY, IDAHO:

SECTION I: Any person shall be eligible to hold the office of Mayor who is a qualified elector of the City at the time of his election and remains a qualified elector during his term of office.


SECTION II: The term of office of Mayor shall be for a period of four (4) years, except as otherwise specifically provided. He shall take office at the time and in the manner provided for installation of Councilpersons.

SECTION III: In case of a temporary vacancy in the office of Mayor due to absence or disability, the president of the City Council shall exercise the office of Mayor during such disability or temporary absence, and until the Mayor shall return. When a vacancy occurs in the office of Mayor by reason of death, resignation or permanent disability, the City Council shall fill the vacancy from within or without the City Council as may be deemed in the best interests of the City, which appointee shall serve until the next general City election, at which election a Mayor shall be

elected for the full four (4) year term.

SECTION IV: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on its passage and approval and the publication of a summary thereof in one (1) issue of the Coeur d'Alene Press, the official newspaper of the City of Dalton Gardens.

Passed under suspension of the rules upon which a roll call vote was duly taken and enacted an ordinance of the City of Dalton Gardens at a regular meeting of the City Council held on the 1st day of November, 1990.
