

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PLANNING AND ZONING
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DALTON GARDENS
FEBRUARY 25, 2021 @ 6:00 pm**

Meeting was called to order by Chairman Becker.

ROLL CALL:

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Commissioner Sampert made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 28, 2021 meeting. Commissioner Drechsel seconded motion. Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Sampert – yes, Commissioner O'Brien – yes, Commissioner Drechsel – yes, Chairman Becker – yes. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING OF SPECIAL USE PERMIT – TIMOTHY NEIL, OWNER OF KRN HOLDINGS, LLC

City Planner Rand Wichman gave a brief background of the Special Use Permit. He stated that the Panhandle Health District, Kootenai County Fire & Recue had no concerns with the permit and the parking at the facility would not be an issue for the owner. He stated that the conditions of the permit would be limited to the nature of use and prohibits any outdoor storage and that all manufacturing would be done within the building.

Public comment period was opened.

Rex DeFee – 7879 Rude Street – He asked about how many employees would be coming to the site.

Public comment period was closed.

The commission stated that there would be no retail sales, just scheduled pick up and that it would be a closed-door operation and sewer is not required at this time.

Commissioner Drechsel made a motion to approve the Special Use Permit in accordance with the with the findings and conclusions as listed in the Order of Decision. Commissioner O'Brien seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Sampert – yes, Commissioner O'Brien – yes, Commissioner Drechsel – yes, Chairman Becker – yes. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING ON SMALL CELL ORDINANCE – CONTINUED

Chairman Becker opened the public comment period and reminded the public that each speaker would need to give name and address for the record and would be allowed 5 minutes to address the commission.


Sampert – yes, Commissioner O'Brien – yes, Commissioner Drechsel – yes, Chairman Becker – yes. Motion carried.
